Music In Worship - Jerusalem

This week's song is a hymn called 'Jerusalem'. 'Jerusalem' is one of the most famous songs ever written. The hymn takes it words from a poem by William Blake and it is often put forward as an alternative English national anthem.

When it was included as a patriotic poem in a 1916 collection for a country at war, it immediately caught the eye of choral composer Hubert Parry. He composed the music for it to help raise morale during a bleak time in our history and became a symbol of hope. It was popular at the time and it is still a firm favourite today.
