Reading at Home

Reading is probably the most important of all the skills a child will learn at school in terms of their ability to access other learning and to become an independent learner. At Harewood, the children are good readers but there is always space for improvement.

In school, we really appreciate all the time families out in with their children reading at home both with their school reading books and with other texts. Any time you can give your child really helps. The ideal



would be to spend 10-15minutes reading with your child everyday but this should be at least 3 times per week. As well as reading the books, re-reading them to develop fluency and confidence and discussing the story are really beneficial.

To help families with home reading we have put together an information booklet for parents, which we will be sending home next week. This guide will probably be full of things you already know but will also contains hints and tips for making home reading both enjoyable and effective. We have also produced a reading bookmark with a number of useful questions to use when discussing the books. Please keep these in with your child's home reading book to refer to.
