Uniform

A really big thank you this week to everyone for looking at the uniform information last week and making improvements where needed. The children looked very smart this week and it would be great to maintain this. Thank you.

Something I didn't mention last week was **Smart Watches**. An increasing number of the children are currently wearing these to school. Whilst we are reluctant to put a blanket ban on them, we are concerned over a few issues.

Firstly their value. We are concerned that losses or breakages of such valuable items could cause upset. Please remember that the children bring things like this entirely at their own risk. School cannot spend lengthy amounts of time dealing with any potential losses and attributing fault.

Secondly, in school they must be used for telling the time only (as a watch). The children must not use any of the 'smart' functions on school premises. All staff and other adults in school have to adhere to strict rules around the use of phones and other such devices for safeguarding reasons. The children must do the same for the protection of themselves and others. There will be a zero tolerance rule on this. Any child caught using, or suspected of using, the smart functions on these devices will not be allowed to continue to wear their device to school.

The safest and simplest thing is not to bring them to school. A simple watch does what it needs to do in terms of helping the children learn about time, but without the connected problems.
