### **Before and After School Club**

A few parents have been asking for clarification on a few details around our

Before and After School Clubs so I thought it was probably worth a message out to everyone.

Before school club is available from 7.45am until the start of school every day. We do not provide breakfast at this session but there is fruit available if the children want it. We are currently not in a position to offer breakfasts but this is something we are looking into for the future. Drop off for Before School Club is at the black gates. Press the buzzer and someone will let you in.

After School Club is split into 2 sessions. The first is 3.20-4.30pm. All the children get a snack, usually toast and then access to a range of activities depending on numbers and the weather. The second session runs from 4.30-6.00pm. If your child stays to this session, an evening meal will be provided, usually around 5pm.









You can collect your child at any time during the sessions by coming to the large black gates and pressing the School Club button. This contacts the staff at the club. They will then bring your child to the school front door. As an alternative to this, you can ring the club directly on 07712 216207 when you arrive and come straight to the front door to collect your child.

Bookings for both clubs are made via the School Money App and should be paid for at the time of booking. We are trying to keep bookings flexible for families by allowing the booking of sessions on an ad hoc basis with bookings closing the night before. This allows us to plan for staffing and any meals. In an emergency, for last minute bookings, please ring the school office and Mrs Flowerdew will book your child in. Please remember that this should only be in emergencies, not a regular occurrence.

Finally, we are coming to the end of the financial year. Please make sure that all outstanding payments to the system are made by the end of next week.

The flexibility of our extended provision is something we want to continue to provide. I know how much this helps families, but please help us with this by booking in advance and making sure payments are made.

#### Wear a Hat Day – Friday 25<sup>th</sup> March

Next Friday is 'Wear a Hat Day' in school. The purpose of the day is to raise awareness and funds for brain tumour research and is organised by the charity Brain Tumour Research (www.braintumourresearch.org). As many of you will be aware, this issue has a very personal link to the Adcock family and it is a fitting charity for us to be able to support as a school.



On the day, the children (and staff) are being encouraged

to wear a hat, as silly or as plain as you wish, and bring in a donation which will aid the charities research into this devastating illness. Please send any donations in an envelope and hand into the class teachers. We also have a small number of pin badges that will be sold on the day. These cost £1. I hope that by supporting them we can in a small way aid the charities research. (Other than the choice of hat it will be normal school uniform.)


#### Music In Worship - 'Happy Day' - co-written by Tim Hughes
