Music In Worship All You Need Is Love – The Beatles

This week's song is called 'All You Need Is Love' by The Beatles. They are regarded as the most influential band of all time and were integral in shaping the face of popular music.



'All You Need is Love' was written in 1967. The song was Britain's contribution to Our World, the first live global television link, for which the band were filmed performing it at EMI Studios in London. The programme was broadcast via satellite and seen by an audience of over 400 million in 25 countries.

Lennon's lyrics for 'All You Need is Love' were deliberately simplistic, to allow for the show's international audience to understand them. The main lyric that is repeated is the title 'All You Need is Love'. The message of this song is that simple, that love, kindness and compassion can solve pretty much any problem.

This week we are thinking about valuing different opinions, sometimes it can be really tricky to resolve issues when people think differently about the same thing. However, it is an important skill in life to learn to value and respect other people's opinions and to learn to work with each other instead of against each other.
