# A Reminder - Clubs for this term

#### **Free School Meals**

At this time of increasing prices and pressures on family budgets, Leeds City Council are keen that schools pass on information to families about their entitlement to a number of benefits or subsidies. One of these is free school meals.







As many parents will be aware, children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are all entitled to a 'universal free school meal'. However, once a child reaches Year 3 families have to pay for school meal unless they are eligible for free school meals due to other family circumstances.

In addition to the support for the eligible family, school also receives funding called Pupil Premium, which based on the number of free school meals eligible children. This funding can make a very big difference to school and the amount of support we can offer, not just to the eligible child but all the other children in school. As a result of the benefit to the family, but also to school, we would encourage any family who thinks they may be entitled to apply. The criteria for eligibility are listed below with some links to both additional information and how to apply.

For your child to qualify for Free School Meals/Pupil Premium, you must get one of the following benefits:

- <u>Universal Credit</u> and your household income after tax is less than £7,400 per year (not including any benefits you get)
- <u>Child Tax Credit</u>, as long as you are not getting <u>Working Tax Credit</u> and have an annual income of less than £16,190
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- The guarantee part of Pension Credit
- Asylum seeker support.

To apply, you need to get in touch with <u>Leeds City Council</u> who will guide you through the process. Also feel free to contact the school office who will also be able to help with information.

Everyone knows that parking in Harewood is not easy, especially at pick up time at the end of the day. Please can I request that everyone parks in a way that is safe and is respectful of the needs of the villagers and other road users. 
