After School Club

I have attached a copy of the activities for next weeks' Before and After School Club for you to look at. Our aim is to publish this regularly so you can get a flavour of the things the children are getting up to on different days.

The After School Club is split into 2 sessions. The first is 3.15pm until 4.30pm and the second from 4.30pm until 6pm. In recent weeks, we have been experiencing quite a few late collections from the first session. This causes staff quite a few problems, especially with the provision of food. This week we have catered for children that have still been with us a long time after the 4.30pm collection time, thinking that they were staying for tea, and then they have been collected before eating, meaning we are wasting food.

Can we please remind families that 4.30pm is the deadline for collection from the first session. You may be charged for the second session if you collect children late without prior warning. If on rare occasions, you are unavoidably delayed, please phone school or After School Club (07712216207) to let us know. We keep the booking system as flexible as we can but we need families to help us maintain this.

Drama Den, Multi-sports, Science, Art and Maths clubs all finish at **4.10pm** with collection from either the office door or the Village Hall. If children are left after these clubs, we will take them to After School Club to be looked after. The staff running these clubs often have other duties to carry out after their clubs (You may be charged for an After School Club session if you are significantly late and have not let us know).
