Collective Worship Music - Good and Faithful Shepherd

This week's song is called 'Good and Faithful Shepherd'. It has been written as part of a collection of songs celebrating the parables.

The song 'Good and Faithful Shepherd' talks about Jesus as a caring shepherd who looks after all of us, just like a shepherd takes care of his sheep.
