Dear parents,

Wow, in the blink of an eye the Christmas holiday was gone! It was lovely to see the children pouring into school on the first snowy Monday back, full of excitement and (thankfully) sharing that Father Christmas had indeed visited.

Straight back to work, we have started our new science topic Plants. This week we have set up an experiment to investigate what plants need to grow. The children were very knowledgeable and keen to set their experiments up. Let's see what happens over the week!

On Monday afternoon, Liz from the British Library visited Class 3 to do a Write like a Poet workshop. We learned all about where she works and how they use robots to navigate the several million books they have (every book ever published in the UK) and many other interesting items. We then analysed a poem by James Berry and then played word association games. Finally, we got to create our own short poems on a theme of out choosing. What a wonderful afternoon.

In English this half term the children will be busy reading the story 'Escape from Pompeii' which will tie in perfectly with their geography topic on earthquakes and volcanoes. We are also looking at poems by Valerie Bloom in English, with some lessons on performance poetry in class and the children will be writing their own poem.

The pupils have come back to school with energy and enthusiasm and, we have all noted, seemingly a little taller!

The emphasis is also on practicing your handwriting as you learn your spellings, homework should be neatly done and the word written at least 3 times. Reading records need three signatures per week. Please encourage your child to practice on Times Tables Rockstars regularly - it really helps them in their maths lessons if they have quick recall of their times tables facts.
