Outstanding Payments to School

We are now very close to the end of the financial year and school needs to make sure that we clear any payments and outstanding balances to enable the budget setting for next year to run more smoothly. Whilst most families are good at paying in advance, there are payments due for school lunches, Before/After School Club and music lessons. These outstanding balances need clearing before the end of the month.

Please can I remind familes that all of the activities and services mentioned should be paid in advance, not afterwards. Music lessons for instance, must be paid for before the half term starts not at the end.

The school budget is extremely tight and we cannot afford to maintain the current levels of outstanding payments. We try to be flexible to help families (Not all schools do) and it would be a shame if we had to start saying that children cannot access lunches, music lessons and clubs if the outstanding balances remain. Mrs Flowerdew regularly sends out messages to update families on outstanding balances. If paying is a problem, please contact us to have a discussion rather than letting the balance build.

The lyrics for this song start by reminding us we are all unique and special but one thing we all have in common is that Jesus is there for all of us, if we want him to be. This week as we think about




